Students must follow all recommended safety considerations.

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3.R.02 Riding Preparation Assessment Information (cont.)

Resources and Equipment

The physical resources required for assessment of this competency requires access to:

- a horse for personal use
- a suitable location with controlled conditions
- horses in a recreational or training program, housed in an appropriate private or commercial establishment
- horses which are quiet and reasonable tractable

The human resources which assess this unit of competency will require to be consistent with those outlined in the Supervisors/Assessors form and terms and conditions.

This is the practical assessment component for 3.R.02 Riding Preparation. It consists of three types of assessment Self, Peer and Trainer/Assessor. The self assessment section is to be filled out by the student.

Peer assessors can be anyone with relevant horse experience (i.e. local riding club member, horse riding friend) and don't require to be registered with us.

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3.R.02 - Riding Preparation

Safely catch, lead and prepare and tack up/saddle up in a safe and appropriate manner (Although a different quiet horse should be used, they should be aware of all potential hazards and consider safely at all times, particularly social behaviour of horses.

Should be shown and then work within procedures of workplace where assessment is taking place)

- Use a halter and lead for catching and leading? (Rope around the neck first, then halter/headcollar)
- Groom the horse?
 (As per previous assessment)
- Saddle then bridle the horse, and check, fit and adjust saddlery as necessary (Horse to remain tied up while saddle and accessories are fitted. Once checked, bridle is fitted. All saddlery to be checked for fit, safety and usability Move around the horse safely, considering individual horse behaviour)

Tie a horse up with a quick release knot?

(The knot should be looped through the baling twine, rather than threaded through to allow the knot to be released with one pull to control horse.)

- Use and halter and lead rope?
- Tie to a piece of baling twine that is secured to a post?

Prepare for riding with appropriate gear and safety equipment? (Should be safe and suitable for riding for at least one hour)

- Jodhpurs, jeans, breeches or other sort of long pant suitable and safe for riding?
- Shirt with sleeves? (fairly snug fitting, no loose flappy material that horse may take fright from)
- Enclosed footwear or riding boots?

 (boots with a heel and little grip on the sole. Alternatively clogs will need to be put on stirrups irons in preparation for riding)

- Helmet with relevant current approved safety standard? (should know how to correctly fit and adjust)
- Consider weather and environmental information to ascertain the impact it would have on riding?
- Consider the suitability of the arena for riding (i.e., hazards, obstacles, terrain.)?
- Assess the horse for suitability and safety for the riding activity

Unsaddle and care for the horse after riding?

(To work safely and efficiently around the horse, being aware of potential hazards)

- Remove the bridle and halter the horse?
- Remove the saddle?
- Cool the horse down?
- Groom and re-rug (if applicable)?
- Return the horse to its housing?

Evaluate the riding session and identify improvements for future riding activities.
