Resources and Equipment

The physical resources required for assessment of this competency requires access to:-

- a horse for personal use
- a suitable location with controlled conditions
- horses in a recreational or training program, housed in an appropriate private or commercial establishment
- horses which are quiet and reasonable tractable

The human resources which assess this unit of competency will require to be consistent with those outlined in the Supervisors/Assessors form and terms and conditions.

This is the practical assessment component for 3.R.01 Grooming & Equipment. It consists of three types of assessment Self, Peer and Trainer/Assessor. The self assessment section is to be filled out by the student.

Peer assessors can be anyone with relevant horse experience (i.e. local riding club member, horse riding friend) and don't require to be registered with us.

Practical Assessment (page 1 of 4)

3.R.01 - Grooming and Equipment

Identify and use appropriate equipment for grooming (Grooming must remove traces of dust, dirt, scurf and dead hair, suitable for a horse living in paddock condition. They should use the following tools competently and efficiently. The horse should be tied up correctly, and aware of all safety considerations)

- Dandy brush
- Curry comb
- Body brush
- Mane and tail comb
- Hoof pick

Safely rug a horse

(To rug, the rug is placed on horse, unfolded, leg straps done up first and threaded through each other, then belly straps (if applicable) fastened, chest straps and finally neck/hood straps (if applicable). The horse should be tied up correctly, and aware of all safety considerations)

Safely unrug a horse

To unrug, buckles are unfastened starting at the front of the horse, neck/hood straps (if applicable), chest straps, belly straps (if applicable), then finally leg straps. Legs straps are re-buckled to the rings before removing the rug. Rug is folded and slid off horse. The horse should be tied up correctly, and aware of all safety considerations)

3.R.01 - Grooming and Equipment

Fit and adjust boots

(The horse should be tied up correctly, and aware of all safety considerations. The boot should be fitted with the following considerations:-)

- Ensure the boot is clean
- Ensure the leg is clean
- Ensure boot protects the desired area
- Middle strap is fastened first, then the bottom, then the top
- Boot is checked for fit and tension
