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3.R.22 Lunging the Horse Assessment Information (cont.)

Resources and Equipment

The physical resources required for assessment of this competency requires access to:-

- a horse for personal use
- a suitable location with controlled conditions
- horses in a recreational or training program, housed in an appropriate private or commercial establishment
- horses which are quiet and reasonable tractable

The human resources which assess this unit of competency will require to be consistent with those outlined in the Supervisors/Assessors form and terms and conditions.

This is the practical assessment component for 3.R.22 Lunging the Horse. It consists of three types of assessment Self, Peer and Trainer/Assessor. The self assessment section is to be filled out by the student.

Peer assessors can be anyone with relevant horse experience (i.e. local riding club member, horse riding friend) and don't require to be registered with us.

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Practical Assessment (page 1 of 4)

3.R.22 - Lunging the Horse

Can you prepare a horse for lunging and demonstrate fitting and adjusting:-

- lunge rein to the cavesson?
- lunge rein to the bridle?

Can you warm up a horse on the lunge, in both directions in preparation for a rider?

During this practical activity do you:-

- Follow instruction or recognised procedure?
- Keep the lunge rein organised, untangled and off the ground?
- Stand in the same spot while lunging the horse, without stepping or walking backwards?
- Maintain a position where the lunge rein, whip and horse form a triangle?
- Warm the horse up in walk, then trot, then canter?
- Lunge the horse on both reins (in both directions)?
- Keep the lunge whip positioned away from the horse when adjusting/changing equipment?
- Maintain control of the horse in all 3 paces?
- Maintain the direction of the horse in all 3 paces?

3.R.22 - Lunging the Horse

- Keep the horse on a consistent circle size?
- Keep the horse on a 20 metre circle?
- Close the gate to the area you are lunging in?
- Apply aids in an unobtrusive manner which is consistent with the training of the horse?
- Communicate with the horse using smooth instructions?
- Secure the reins in a way which is safe and where the horse will not become entangled in them whilst being lunged?
- Secure the stirrups in a way which is safe and prevents them from hitting the horse whilst it is being lunged?

Do you select a suitable area to lunge the horse in?

Does this area:-

- Have safe and suitable fencing?
- Fully enclosed?
- Have safe and suitable footing?
- Free from hazards and obstacles?
