This is the practical assessment component for 3.T.14 Supervise Horse Handling. It consists of three types of assessment Self, Peer and Trainer/Assessor. The self assessment section is to be filled out by the student.

Peer assessors can be anyone with relevant horse experience (i.e. local riding club member, horse riding friend) and don't require to be registered with us.

- ensure the handler uses correct technique to move from one side of the horse to another (i.e. either stays close to the hind end and keeps a hand on the horse or walks a wide arc around the hind end)?
- observe the horse for signs of behaviour that may pose a hazard or risk to the handler?
- ensure the saddle is the correct fit for the horse?
- ensure and instruct the handler on the correct placement of the saddlecloth?
- instruct the handler on the correct placement of the saddle?
- ensure buckles on the girth are fitted and adjusted correctly?



Notes for Assessors

Assessors must be approved and issued with an 'Assessor Number' prior to assessment. Assessors must only assess in the areas they have been approved for in writing (Peer assessment is a continuation of self-assessment, and peer assessors are not required to be registered or approved by OnlineHorseCollege.com)

OnlineHorseCollege.com provides training in the horse industry and all training and assessment is to be done in the horse industry environment. Skills should be assessed in line with a professional working in the horse industry. During assessment the student should reflect this in their behaviour

The 3.T.13 Supervise Horse Handling assessments should reflect current or aspiring individuals operating as general equestrian coaches or equestrian show horse coaches at a local, regional or state level. Duties may include instructing, planning, conducting and evaluating training sessions and competitions. This also involves supervising practice sessions, preparing for competitions and completing post-competition analysis on performance.

When competent, they will have the skills and knowledge to relate anatomical and physiological features to the care and treatment of horses, identify basic anatomy and physiology of horses, relate anatomy and body systems to the performance of horses, and follow illness and injury management plans for horses.
