The human resources which assess this unit of competency will require to be consistent with those outlined in the Supervisors/Assessors form and terms and conditions.

This is the practical assessment component for 3.T.17 Rider Assessments. It consists of three types of assessment Self, Peer and Trainer/Assessor. The self assessment section is to be filled out by the student.

Peer assessors can be anyone with relevant horse experience (i.e. local riding club member, horse riding friend) and don't require to be registered with us.

3.T.17 – Lunging The Horse

In a lunge lesson, can you assess a riders' level of ability?

During this assessment do you:-

- Introduce yourself?
- Introduce the lesson subject/purpose (i.e. to assess riders' abilities)?
- Observe (and if necessary correct) mounting technique including how/if the rider holds the reins, which side of the horse the rider prepares to mount and the level of ease and fluency of mounting?
- Assess (and if necessary correct) techniques used to hold the reins and lengthen and shorten the reins?
- View the rider (and if necessary provide guidance and corrections) in rising trot with attention to the balance, rhythm, co-ordination, ease and fluency of the rider?
- Test the riders' knowledge and technique of rising trot in walk before assessing them in trot?
- View the rider (and if necessary provide guidance and corrections) in sitting trot with attention to the balance, rhythm, co-ordination, ease and fluency of the rider?
- Observe (and if necessary correct) the riders application, technique and effectiveness of the natural aids in transitions to and between halt, walk and trot?
- Observe (and if necessary correct) the riders application, technique and effectiveness of the artificial aids (if used) in transitions to and between halt, walk and trot?
- Keep the lunge rein organised, untangled and off the ground?

- Assess hazards and act appropriately?
- Demonstrate an understanding of safe procedures?
- Perform a gear check at the beginning of the lesson (including girth tension, stirrup length for rider, safety of the gear in regards to stitching and wear, fit of the gear)?
- Check the riders' experience and disabilities?
- Ensure the lesson area was safe and secure?
- Maintain a position where you could see the student at all times?
- Use a warm up that was relevant to the lesson?
- Maintain a positive attitude?
- Use and explain if necessary, correct terminology and commands?
- Have adequate voice volume and projection?
- Present yourself in a professional manner?
- Demonstrate good time management skills?

- Ensure the riders' dress, footwear, helmet and other related factors are evaluated to be safe and appropriate to participate?
- Assess the horse's temperament, level of training, level of fitness and ability to determine suitability for the requirements of the lesson?
- Monitor relevant organisational issues and provide feedback where necessary to maintain control and safety?
- Demonstrate stance, posture, signals and movements in accordance with best practice body language approaches used within equestrian sports?
- Maintain ethical responsibilities in your role as a coach?

Assessors must only assess in the areas they have been approved for in writing (Peer assessment is a continuation of self-assessment, and peer assessors are not required to be registered or approved by OnlineHorseCollege.com)

The 3.T.17 Rider Assessments assessments should reflect current or aspiring individuals operating as general equestrian coaches or equestrian show horse coaches at a local, regional or state level. Duties may include instructing, planning, conducting and evaluating training sessions and competitions. This also involves supervising practice sessions, preparing for competitions and completing post-competition analysis on performance.

When competent, they will have the skills and knowledge to relate anatomical and physiological features to the care and treatment of horses, identify basic anatomy and physiology of horses, relate anatomy and body systems to the performance of horses, and follow illness and injury management plans for horses.
